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Course Objective:

To study important works of art (sculpture, painting, mosaic, ceramics, etc.) and architecture produced in the ancient Near East, ancient Egypt, and Paleolithic-Medieval Europe, within the context of the cultures that created them.

2. **QUIZZES: NO MAKE-UPS** (you receive NO CREDIT if you miss a quiz). The Slide ID Quiz scores are incorporated into your two Exams. The images come from your Slide List, which, in turn, is comprised of works from both your text and the Digital Database Slideshows. Each image is shown briefly (a minute or so), and you must identify it as it is noted on your Slide List: work, medium, era, date, etc. The Christian Imagery Quiz (from Janson 240) tests your basic knowledge of personalities and events from the life of Jesus as illustrated in Early Christian through Gothic art.

3. **ESSAYS**: These are formal essays, NOT research papers. With an emphasis on Formal Analysis, Essay I is a 'compare/contrast' discussion using two works from a list I will provide. In Essays II & III, you will relate a literary excerpt (found on ANGEL) from a primary source to a work of art/architecture. We will discuss how to compose these essays in class.

FOR EACH ESSAY:

- a) UPLOAD YOUR PAPER TO TURNITIN.COM, AS WELL AS TURN IN AN IDENTICAL HARD COPY ON THE DUE DATE (I WILL NOT ACCEPT PAPERS VIA EMAIL).
- b) GRADES WILL BE LOWERED FOR THOSE ESSAYS (either the hard copy or the TURNITIN upload) TURNED IN AFTER THE DUE DATE.
- c) I WILL NOT GRADE A PAPER IF IT HAS NOT BEEN UPLOADED TO TURNITIN.
