- Visits to the Olympic Parks in Berlin and Munich, the Brandenburg Gate in Berlin, the Nazi Party Rally Grounds in Nuremberg, Dachau Concentration Camp, and other monument and memorial sites.
- Opportunities to explore the history and culture of Berlin, Nuremberg, and Munich.

Course Objectives:

- Learn about the rise and fall of Nazism.
- Analyze the “aestheticization of politics” by viewing Nazi architecture and visiting the sites of party rallies and parades.
- Examine how Munich, Nuremberg, and Berlin represent and confront the history of the Nazi period today.
