WHEREAS,	The University has a Behavioral Evaluation and Threat Assessment (BETA) policy that institutes policies and procedures for collecting information and monitoring individuals reported to be behaving in certain ways (even those exhibiting "Low Risk" behavior), culminating in the formation of a BETA Team; and
WHEREAS,	The policy has many questionable omissions, including the fact that it does not require disclosure of the reported behavior to the individual at question, and
WHEREAS,	The policy has many questionable requirements, including the fact that Individuals may be "reported" and not know they were reported or that they are being monitored, and
WHEREAS,	There appears to have been minimal input from UAH faculty, staff and students, the main constituencies affected by this policy,
NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED	
That the Behavioral Evaluation and Threat Assessment policy be reworked completely by an ad-hoc committee with the participation of members of the UAH faculty, staff and students as well as personnel that wrote the original version of the bill.	
AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED	

That the ad-hoc committee produce a new version of the Behavioral

Evaluation and Threat Assessment policy, before the beginning of the 2012-2013 academic year.
