For this block, the candidates are required to:

- 1) Learn from a professional in the field (YOU) about good teaching practice and strategies for at least 70 hours per semester (unless special circumstances);
- Arrange a schedule for observation times twice a week (3 hours minimum per visit) with respective cooperating teacher(s) (CT) based upon their course schedule. With the approval of the CT, the candidate should have an active, *participatory* role in the classroom.
- 3) Observe, reflect, and evaluate overall teaching practices and strategies used in the class based on ideas and theories discussed in UAH classes working with students and you as the CT.

ED 371 ED 671	Write a lesson plan, video-record teaching the lesson with a class, and analyze assessment data from the lesson. In addition, collect a writing assignment (this can be taught by the classroom teacher), grade the assignment providing feedback, then analyze the data and feedback that was provided.		
ED 372 ED 672	Collect anonymized demographic data to use in a written report regarding social science instruction and assessment. If possible, candidates are encouraged to teach any social studies content either during a direct lesson or as part of another lesson.		
ED 309 ED 609	Observe one student as a "case study" within the classroom and in another academic setting to focus on behavior in multiple environments. Candidates will need to collect some basic demographic information about students, but all will be kept anonymous.		
ED 375 ED 575	Candidates are asked to <b>work with one student and conduct</b> an Informal Reading Assessment (IRI).		
ED 405 ED 615	Candidates are asked to administer a <i>Bader Reading and Language Inventory</i> with a struggling reader. Then they are to develop and deliver three (3) lessons to the student addressing areas in which the student struggles. They are to discuss each of these lessons with you so that you can provide them feedback and/or suggestions. Candidates are also required to administer a reading interest survey to the class.		

If the candidate is assigned to more than one teacher, only one evaluation is required from the cooperating teacher with whom the candidate spent the most time.
