

UAH EPP Timeline

1967: UAH establishes the Department of Education within the College of Liberal Arts and conferred a initial certification degree in elementary education (B.A.)

1967-2014: UAH establishes initial certification programs (undergraduate and graduate) housed within the College of Liberal Arts (History and English) and College of Science (Biology, Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics)

Fall 2013: UAH College of Education assumes responsibility for the RISE School, a pre-school program for students with and without disabilities

Fall 2014: College of Education established along with the Department of Curriculum and Instruction and Department of Kinesiology

Spring 2014: Master of Education (M.Ed.) (advanced programs) established with concentrations in Elementary and Autism Spectrum Disorders

Spring 2015: Concentrations in Secondary Education, Reading Specialist, and ESOL added to the M.Ed. program

Spring 2015: Dr. Beth Quick named UAH College of Education's founding Dean.

Summer 2015: Dr. Derrick Smith named Chair of the Department of Curriculum and Instruction

Spring 2015: B.S. in Secondary Education established within the College of Education.

Fall 2015: B.S. in Early Childhood and Early Childhood Special Education Program established

Fall 2015: B.S. in Kinesiology Concentration in Physical Education

Fall 2015: Master of Arts in Teaching Secondary Education (initial programs) (with concentrations in biology, chemistry, physics, mathematics, history, English, and ESOL)

Spring 2016: Establishment of full-time position as Coordinator of Field and Clinical Experiences

Spring 2016: Establishment of academic advisor for teacher education

Fall 2016: Early Learning Center (ELC) established after acquiring Huntsville's City University Place Elementary School.

Fall 2016: First State-funded Pre-K classroom established at UAH ELC.

Fall 2017: Began partnership with HeadStart and Early HeadStart

Fall 2017: Began piloting edTPA for all student interns

Fall 2017: Establishment of the B.A. in Visual Art with a concentration in Education

Fall 2018: edTPA became consequential

Fall 2018: Master in Applied Behavior Analysis established

Spring 2018: Dr. Derrick Smith named Associate Dean of the College of Education

Fall 2018: Dr. Wolfram Verlaan named Chair of the Department of Curriculum and Instruction

Fall 2018: Establishment of a preschool classroom for students with autism spectrum disorders

Spring 2018: Master of Arts in Teaching in Elementary Education established

Spring 2018: Concentration in Visual Impairments added to the M.Ed. program

Spring 2019: Master of Arts in P-12 Education (Music and Physical Education) established
