Have your child stand facing the cups with the ball in front and kick the ball towards the cups. Look at the cups that were knocked over and ask your child what the letter is. If they're not sure, identify it for them and try again 😊</p> <p>*See notes</p>	<p><u>Shape Coloring Activity</u></p> <p>Draw some shapes on a large piece of paper and tape to the wall. Try to guide him/her in finding items that are heavy and light. Then, grab a clear container and fill it with water or fill up the sink/tub and have your child test if each item</p>

Have your child gather a variety of rocks from outside and then practice tossing the rocks into a bucket, bin, or even a kid sized pool! Fill whatever container you decide to use with some water. Talk about the different rocks and if they made a big or a little splash. When finished tossing, have your child scoop out the rocks and count (count with your child if needed) how many he/she has!</p>	<p><u>Number Toy Hunt Activity</u></p> <p>All you need for this activity are pieces of paper (to use for number mats) and toys. Have your child “hunt for small toys” and put a toy on each circle of the number mat while counting aloud. *See notes</p>	<p>sinks or floats. Kick the Cup (physical):



We've been identifying capital letters in school. The children have been learning the first letter in their names as well as their friends'. Start with A, B, C, D, E, F, G, I, and L. You can also start introducing them to the other lowercase letters in their name using this game.

Family Friday Book Time: Core Words Find and Play

Have your child pick a favorite book to read together. Focus on core words Find and Play while reading. Ask him or her to "find the _____" naming any object on the page. Ask "Would you like to play with _____?" naming the different characters in the story. Why or why not?

Paper Tunnel Ball Rolling Activity (Friday)- See below for a picture of what this activity looks like:



Tape the sides of the pieces of paper down and create some tunnels. Have your child take a small ball and practice aiming and trying to roll the ball through the different tunnels. Have fun and make a game out of this! You can even use some toy cars for this instead of balls! If your child is not ready for this yet, practice taking turns by rolling the ball back and forth with your child on the floor.

Number Toy Hunt Activity (Math)- See below for some pictures of what this activity looks like:



When prepping this activity, use whatever numbers your child is ready for and write those numbers on the pieces of paper and draw the corresponding number of circles for your child to place the toys on. Have your child count or help your child count as he/she is placing a toy on each circle. You may need to tape the paper down so that it does not wiggle around too much. You can also use paper plates if you have those at home instead of plain paper. This works on number identification and one-to-one correspondence counting skills. Do not forget to have your child go on a hunt for toys that he/she can use!

Campfire Process Art (Fine Motor)- See below for a picture of what this activity looks like:



Remember it is not about the product, but the process for this activity! Your child will be working on strengthening his/her little hands and fingers and getting ready for future writing skills by scribbling with the markers. In addition, if you choose to use a squirt bottle of water instead of painting the water on, your child will be required to squeeze and strengthen his/her hands even more! You may want to put something under the coffee filter, like shown above, for when the marker bleeds through. Although, the marker can be easily wiped up when washable! Watch as the colors bleed together beautifully! Hang to dry and then the campfire is complete. No coffee filters, no problem! Use a paper towel to scribble on or just a plain piece of white paper, but the paper towel will work better for this activity.
