Humpty Dumpty (I love you Ritual):

Breathing choices for you children (if they forgot some of them)

 <p>Drain</p> <p>Extend arms out, pretending your arms are faucets. Tighten arm, shoulder, and face muscles. Exhale slowly making a "ssshhh" sound and release all your muscles, draining out the stress.</p>	 <p>S.T.A.R.</p> <p>Smile, Take a deep breath And Relax. Encourage belly breathing where the tummy goes out when the air goes in, and in when the air goes out. Also help children learn to exhale slower than they inhale.</p>
 <p>Pretzel</p> <p>Standing up, cross your ankles. Now cross your right wrist over left, turn your hands so your thumbs are facing the floor, put palms together and interlace fingers. Bend your elbows out and gently turn your hands down and toward your body until they rest on the center of your chest. Put your tongue on the roof of your mouth. Relax and breathe.</p>	 <p>Balloon</p> <p>Place your hands on top of your head and interlace your fingers. Breathe in through your nose as you raise your arms, inflating an imaginary balloon. Release the air in the balloon by pursing your lips, exhaling slowly, lowering your arms and making a "pbbppppb" sound.</p>

TeachingStrategies

This Is the Way the Lady Rides

Primary Objectives

- 4. Demonstrates traveling skills.
- 14b. Engages in sociodramatic play.

Why It's Important

While a child may enjoy pretend play, initially he may have trouble creating imaginative situations on his own. Offering ideas for pretending will help him invent his own roles and situations in the future.

Materials

Broomstick or hobbyhorse


What You Do

1. Make a clear path around the room to allow for movement, or you can do this activity outside. Be prepared to sing the following: *This is the way the lady rides, the lady rides, the lady rides. This is the way the lady rides, so early in the morning. Substitute other words for lady, e.g., farmer, police officer, monkey, daisy.*
2. Invite your child to play with you. Explain that you will sing a song while pretending to ride a horse around the room.
3. Give him the hobbyhorse or broomstick. Demonstrate how to hold onto the stick with both hands and straddle it while moving around the room. Encourage him to copy your movements.
4. Change the tempo for each verse. For example, when imitating the lady, gallop at a moderate pace, speed up for the police officer, and slow down for the farmer.
5. As you sing the song, lead your child around the room, demonstrating the movements as needed. When you are finished singing, give your child an opportunity to lead the movement and song.
6. Encourage him to think of new ways to ride the horse. He can incorporate any type of galloping, running, dancing, etc. Follow his lead as he shows you his new movement.

Bread Recipe
