Dr. Emil Jovanov, a professor of electrical and computer engineering at UAH, has been elected a Fellow of the National Academy of Inventors (NAI), the highest professional distinction awarded solely to academic inventors.

Dr. Lee Ellenburg appointed new Alabama state climatologist

Alabama Governor Kay Ivey has appointed Dr. Lee Ellenburg as the state's new climatologist. The appointment marks a leadership transition for the Alabama Office of the State Climatologist, which is housed within The University of Alabama in Huntsville's Earth System Science Center (ESSC) and serves as a primary source of climate monitoring, analysis and information for the state. Ellenburg succeeds Dr. John Christy, director of the ESSC, who has served as state climatologist since 2000.

"I am deeply honored to be named the Alabama state climatologist," Ellenburg says. "Serving Alabama in this role allows me to bring more than a decade of applied climate and water research into direct service of the state."
