COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The Sport Administration internship is a class to introduce and promote professionalism through a hands-on experience with a local company. The student will be guided by a faculty member and representative from the company to achieve project completion and a strong overall work experience pertaining to the student's interests.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

The class objectives will be dictated by the type of internship and the needs of the company. The student must go through the interview process to be "hired" by the company and will receive projects directly from the employer. The faculty member will be available in an advisory role.
