Why IS Alabama . . . ?

July 21 - Session 1: *Moderator is Toni Reynolds.* This session will provide factual background information about Alabama history, including key dates and events; will review our six state constitutions from 1819 to today; will review attempts made to modify the 1901 Constitution; and will offer a perspective of our state's cultural history, as viewed by noted



historians and authors. Speakers: Constitution Hall 1819 Re-enactors; Dr. Emily Cook, UAHuntsville; Dr. Bill Stewart, UA in Tuscaloosa; and Dr. Eric Green, Alabama A&M.

July 22 - Session 2: Moderator is Dorcas Harris. This session will focus on facts about Alabama's current 1901 Constitution, summarizing it in a short DVD; will review the constitution's 18 Articles in 287 Sections; outline its 799 current amendments, and conclude with how the constitution works with the primary state companion document, the State Code of 1975. Speakers: "It's A Thick Book" DVD; followed by Mr. Ed Gentle of Gentle, Turner and Sexton, Birmingham; Mr. Terry Turner also of Gentle, Turner and Sexton; and, Dr. Jess Brown, Athens State.

July 28 - Session 3: Moderator is Hartwell Lutz. This session will provide a discussion of governance under the 1901 Constitution as viewed by the Executive Branch and by three representatives of the Legislative Branch, two from the House and one from the Senate. These representatives will offer arguments PRO and CON for issues and approaches to Constitutional Reform. Speakers: Mr. Bryan Taylor (R), Policy Director, Governor's Office; Rep. Mike Ball (R), District 10 (Madison Co.); Rep. Jeff McLaughlin (D), District 27 (Marshall Co.); and Sen. Bobby_Denton (D) [invited], District 1 (Colbert, Lauderdale Co.).

July 29 - Session 4: Moderator is Jerry Jennings. This session will focus on North Alabama and explore how we may be impacted by changes to the State Constitution, especially to home rule and to taxes. There will be a moderated panel discussion among invited citizens from the local area. Speakers: Mr. Mo Brooks, Commissioner Madison County District 5; Mr. Tommy Battle, Mayor of Huntsville; and a distinguished panel of local citizens, including, Mr. Devinti Williams, Attorney, and Mr. John Ehinger, retired Journalist. Other panelists' names will be announced shortly.

A Day at Cheekwood

Neither threat of storm nor relentless rain dissuaded OLLI members from their planned excursion to Cheekwood in Nashville, TN, on May 1, 2009. Glimpses of sun during the drive offered the travelers optimism that the rain might cease, but it refused until late evening, by which time most of the travelers had begun the return trip, never having set foot in one of Cheekwood's eleven gardens.

Nevertheless, most members of the brave troupe would say they enjoyed the outing. The group toured the Cheekwood mansion, the former home of Maxwell House coffee magnate Leslie Cheek. Along with
