OLLI's 20th Anniversary Scholarship Campaign

In 1993, Dr. Mike Oliver, then
Director of Continuing Education,
decided to establish an all-volunteer
program that would provide
Educational opportunities for senior
Huntsvillians. As a model, he chose
a similar program at the University of
Alabama in Birmingham, and created
the Academy for Lifelong Learning to
merge the academic goals of The

University of Alabama in Huntsville with the needs of a unique community with strong academic values, a history of innovative thinking, and a fondness for being in the company of kindred minds. From an initial 107 members the first year, the organization grew to a peak of 1100 members. Time and again, when Huntsville was, and is, listed in

national rankings for things like entrepreneurship, retirement, or quality of life, the Academy (now the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute at UAH) receives mention as an Integral resource for both the university and the community.

OLLI's 20th Anniversary Scholarship Campaign, continued from p. 1

In 2004, in recognition of their 10th anniversary, members of the Academy looked for a way to honor the organization's accomplishments and thank our UAH host. Our all-volunteer group was thriving, but many still felt that we should do more to support the University's primary mission: to train the students who would build the future. It was decided to establish an Academy (now OLLI)-UAH Scholarship Fund with a goal of reaching the minimum \$10,000 endowment

level. Thanks to the generosity of our members, the endowment level was reached the very next year in 2005, and the first scholarship award of \$650 was given in 2006.

Criteria for the OLLI-UAH Scholarship were established as the following: open to any college or major; based on a demonstrated financial need: recipient must maintain a "B" average (3.0 on a 4.0 scale); and renewable for 3 years. Recipients were to be selected by the University's scholarship application process. Through the years, we've been delighted to meet with recipients of our scholarship at the Scholarship Luncheons and at our annual meetings, and to read their thank-you letters on what our scholarship means to them. They are shining examples of both UAH's dedication to academic excellence and the value that OLLI places on lifelong learning.

Fast forward, and here we are about to reach the grand old age of 20! We have a successful working relationship with the University and the organization is an important adjunct to it, still receiving mention in several national publications as an goal, and 20 generous donors

integral part of the community's quality of life. And the OLLI-UAH Scholarship provides support for two exceedingly grateful UAH students! But we find that the changing times have not been kind to students. Tuition for resident students is over \$8700 (not including housing, books or fees)--a stellar bargain for quality higher education but still perilously close to being out-of-reach for some deserving students.

Now, at 20, an evaluation of OLLI's progress ends up being the same as it was at our 10th Anniversary: We need to strengthen our efforts to support the education of those who will shape the future! Thus, in honor of OLLI's 20th Anniversary, we'd like to set a new interim goal for the OLLI-UAH Scholarship of reaching at least \$50,000 in member contributions to the Scholarship by April 30, 2013.

Our goal isn't so far away. Prior to the November 2. Juncheon, 363 OLLI members had contributed almost \$45,000 over the life of the OLLI-UAH Scholarship Fund—some in lump sums, some at regular intervals. At that luncheon, we announced our 20th Anniversary Scholarship Campaign for the new contributed a total of \$871!! As

more of our members make contributions to the OLLI-UAH Scholarship, you can watch our in investments in the future grow on the large campaign progress thermometer in the OLLI quarters.

During the next six months, we challenge you to help meet our new goal for the OLLI-UAH Scholarship. Make a contribution (large or small) to the OLLI 20th Anniversary Scholarship (TASC), checks payable to OLLI,

> and give to the OLLI Office or mail to the OLLI Treasurer, PO Box 1581, Huntsville, AL 35807. Remember our campaign in your year-end giving or estate plans. Multiply your own contribution through company/retirement matching programs, or forming your own challenge group. Talk to at least 5 people about our dedication to high academic

goals for OLLI and for UAH students. and ask that they contribute to our scholarship. Invest some of your time and talents in thinking about how we can increase our OLLI's investment in the future of UAH students and share your ideas with the Board. All Photo Workship


