HOCKEY 101 - Free Class and Ticket Discounts!

UAH has a long and proud history of NCAA hockey, and OLLI has an equally proud history of supporting the only Division I hockey team south of the Mason-Dixon line! The UAH hockey coach, Kurt Kleinendorst, has offered to present a basic hockey course to interested OLLI members on Friday, May 10, at 10:30 a.m. The presentation will be held at Spragins Hall (home of UAH Basketball and Volleyball) in the Varsity Room on the first floor. Light refreshments will be served. Parking is available on the south side of the building (using the stairs to enter) as well as handicapped parking and access on the west side of the building, off Ben Graves Drive.

Earlier this year UAH was accepted as a member of the Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA), a premier conference, which includes Alaska-Anchorage, Alaska-Fairbanks, Bemidji State, Bowling Green, Ferris State, Lake Superior State, Michigan Tech, Minnesota State, and Northern Michigan. The team will have 18 home games this year, starting in October, at the Von Braun Center. OLLI members have the unprecedented opportunity of purchasing Season Tickets to the entire 2013-2014 schedule at a special, discounted rate. The normal price of a Season Ticket is currently set at \$192 per person, but for a limited time OLLI members can buy them for \$120! A Season Ticket will ensure you have the same lower level seat at every home game in a designated OLLI section, as well as first priority for any post-season matches. If you cannot attend one of the games, you are welcomed and encouraged to pass your ticket to a friend.

OLLI continues to be an integral part of the UAH community, and our support will certainly be noticed! Not only will your ticket purchase support the student athletes who have chosen UAH for their education, but it will also provide another means of publicity for the OLLI program and member recruitment. 



What do membership in OLLI and free OLLI Holiday Party tickets have in common?

In the Spotlight: The OLLI Board of Directors



General Obligations

The Board of Directors manages the business and affairs of the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute (OLLI). Monthly meetings and special meetings, as appropriate, are held to review activities and to conduct business to assure the smooth operation of the organization. The Board of Directors is composed of members of OLLI. A nominating committee selects candidates from the general membership, and these candidates are then elected by the general membership to three year terms. Board members are limited to serving two consecutive full three-year terms. They must remain off the board for a full year before being eligible for re-election to the Board.

Board Officers

Members of the board also serve as officers of OLLI. Officers consist of president, vice president, vice president-curriculum, secretary, and treasurer. The president is the principal executive officer of OLLI, supervising and controlling all of the business and affairs of OLLI and presiding over all board meetings and all meetings of the general membership. The vice president serves in these capacities in the absence or unavailability of the president. The vice president is also the chair of the curriculum committee and guides that committee in shaping the OLLI curriculum and overall conduct of OLLI classes.

The secretary prepares the minutes of all meetings of the Board of Directors

and is responsible for maintaining the primary files of OLLI. The treasurer is responsible for all funds and securities of OLLI, receiving annual dues from OLLI members and depositing these funds in banks or other financial institutions as appropriate. The treasurer pays all bills charged against the OLLI organization.

Other board members chair the various committees that provide and organize OLLI's services to its members. Those committees are Special Events, Nominating, Member Services, Social Events, Public Relations, and Cultural. OLLI board members serve on a minimum of two committees.
