Tuesday, January 10, 10 AM, **Birding Excursion**, Wheeler Wildlife Refuge. OLLI is invited to witness an unforgettable phenomena: thousands of large birds appear right before your eyes, including the 46-inch tall Sandhill Cranes, a variety of ducks, geese and hawks, and maybe the very rare Whooping Cranes. Meet at the Visitor Center, located on the south side of Alabama Highway 67 about halfway between I-65 Exit 334 West just south of the Tennessee River and US Highway 31 in Decatur. (GPS coordinates are 34.547406, -86.951136). A Ranger will tell us about the birds we can expect to see, then walk us to the glass-walled Wildlife Observation Building for our special experience. Bring your binoculars or use the built-in telescopes. Come early and see the wildlife exhibits in the Visitor's Center. Stay one hour or more. Carpooling is recommended. 
Notes from our Curriculum Committee






