The Andrew W Mellon Fellowships in Humanistic Studies [Art History, Classics, Comparative Literature, Critical Theory, Cultural Anthropology, Cultural Studies, including all Area Studies, English Literature, Ethnic Studies, Ethnomusicology, Foreign Language and Literature, History, History and Philosophy of Mathematics, History and Philosophy of Science, Humanities, Interdisciplinary Studies, Cultural Linguistics, Music History and Theory, Philosophy, Political Philosophy, Political Theory, Religion, Religious Studies, Rhetoric, and Women's Studies] are designed to help exceptionally promising students prepare for careers of teaching and scholarship in humanistic disciplines. The Mellon Foundation is a competitive award for first-year doctoral students. Fellows may take their awards to any accredited graduate program in the United States or Canada. The Fellowship covers graduate tuition and required fees for the first year of graduate study and includes a stipend of \$17,500. Scores from the general test of the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) are required.

The Ford Foundation International Fellowships Program (IFP) provides opportunities for advanced study to exceptional individuals who will use this education to become leaders in their respective fields, furthering development in their own countries and greater economic and social justice worldwide. To ensure that Fellows are drawn from diverse backgrounds, IFP will actively recruit candidates from social groups and communities that lack systematic access to higher education. The International Fellowships Program provides support for up to three years of formal graduate-level study. Fellows will be selected from countries in Asia, Africa, the Middle East, Latin America and Russia, where the Ford Foundation maintains active overseas programs. U.S. Nationals are not eligible, although Fellows may study in the United States. Fellows may enroll in masters or doctoral programs and may pursue any academic discipline or field of study in the following areas: Children, Youth and Family, Sexuality and Reproductive Health, Work-Force Development, Development Finance and Economic Security, Environment and Development, Community Development, Education Reform, Higher Education and Scholarship, Religion, Society and Culture, Media, Arts and Culture, Human Rights, International Cooperation, Governance, and Civil Society. The Foundation currently works in 15 fields to strengthen democratic values, reduce poverty and injustice, promote international cooperation, and advance human achievement. The program will provide placement assistance to those Fellows not yet admitted to graduate school. IFP support will enable Fellows to undertake short term language study and training in research and computer skills prior to graduate school enrollment. Ford Fellows must: Demonstrate excellence in their undergraduate studies and hold a baccalaureate degree or its equivalent, have experience in community service or development-related activities, pursue a post-baccalaureate degree that will directly enhance their leadership in an academic, policy, practical, or artistic discipline or field corresponding to one or more of the Foundation's areas of endeavor, present a plan specifying how they will apply their studies to social problems or issues in their own countries, and commit themselves to working in these issues following the fellowship period.

The Special Caribbean Fellowships Program (SPECAF) is an instrument at the regional level for the financing of studies leading to a Bachelor's degree at universities and other educational institutions in OAS member States. Studies may be undertaken in any of the member States of the Organization of American States, with the exception of the country of which the candidate is a citizen or permanent resident. . Fellowships normally begin with the commencement of the academic year. Fellowships are granted initially for periods of up to twelve months. Fellowships may be extended upon request for a second period not greater than the initial period. In no case will a fellowship be extended for a total fellowship of more than two years. Fellowship, scholarship, and training award programs are managed by the Division of Human Development of the Department of Information Technology for Human Development, Inter-American Agency for Cooperation and Development.
