



NEW STUDENT ORIENTATION

CLASS REGISTRATION

The class registration period for each academic semester opens the semester prior and is based on your academic classification. Dates are announced at uah.edu/registrar/registration and sent to your UAH email.

Before registering for classes each semester, please make an appointment with your academic advisor to ensure a successful course registration. Find your advisor at uah.edu/advising.

CLASS REGISTRATION TIPS

- ▶ Research class options within your plan of study. You can see your detailed plan of study within the Academic Catalog (catalog.uah.edu), and you can research class schedules using the online Schedule Planner located at my.uah.edu.
- ▶ You can view your completed schedule at my.uah.edu by selecting “Student Detail Schedule” or “Week at a Glance”. Add your class schedule to your UAH Google Calendar to help you stay organized.
- ▶ Adding/dropping classes can be completed until a certain date and time each calendar year. Please consult the Academic Calendar at uah.edu/registrar/calendars.
 - ▶ Speak with your academic advisor when making changes to your schedule. Adding/dropping classes can affect your financial aid and your university bill.
- ▶ Speak with your academic advisor when changing your major within your college. If you need to change your major to one within a different college, please complete a “Change of College” form with the Registrar’s Office at uah.edu/registrar.

What is an Academic Advisor?

Your academic college provides dedicated staff to help you plan your academic career. Academic advisors can help with course selection, degree planning, and understanding the academic requirements needed to graduate. They can also provide guidance on career goals, campus resources, and strategies for academic success. Find your academic advisor at uah.edu/academic-advising.



What is a College Dean?

The dean of your academic college will work to create a positive learning environment within the college and advocate for the needs of both students and faculty. Their job is to ensure the quality of education, manage faculty and staff, and develop policies to support your academic success. You can turn to your dean with questions about academic concerns or program policies.

What is a Syllabus?

Your syllabus will contain the class schedule, course objectives, required materials, and grading policies for each of your registered courses. It can serve as a guide to help you understand what is expected of you during the semester and how to manage your time effectively.

Make sure you check your syllabus regularly for important assignments, tests, and deadlines!



DISABILITY SUPPORT SERVICES

Did you have a 504 plan or an IEP in high school? You may be eligible to apply for reasonable accommodations with Disability Support Services with the appropriate supporting documentation from your doctor or provider.

Disability Support Services provides academic, housing, and meal plan accommodations on campus. We work with you to understand your strengths, identify and reduce your barriers, and determine reasonable accommodations through an interactive process so you can access your education as you work toward your goals.

- ▶ Create a weekly schedule. Actively using a schedule helps you manage your time better. Remember to include study hours outside of classroom time.
- ▶ Take advantage of your professors' office hours. They can help you solidify your understanding of the material.
- ▶ Utilize multiple study methods, including self-quizzing. Self-quizzing promotes understanding and retention of material.
- ▶ Vary your study habits until you find the combination that works best for you.


UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH

BILL PAYMENT TIMELINE

Fall semester tuition charges are posted to student accounts **mid-July**.

All charges (tuition, fees, meal plans, housing, etc.) are due on the **first official day of each semester**.

- Go to uah.edu/registrar/calendars to determine the first official day of the semester.
- All payments are made to UAH via the Bursar's Office.

Installment plan enrollment is open approximately **one month prior to the beginning of a semester** and is available until approximately midterms.

- Installment payment plans are accessed via the UAH website (uah.edu/bursar). Four- and five-part plans are available until the last day to add/drop classes. Installment plans are available for spring, summer, and fall semesters.

After add/drop closes for the term, a one-time \$50 late fee is assessed for any student with an unpaid balance.

- The exception to this would be those students who have an active installment payment plan and have made the first payment on that installment plan.

Spring semester tuition charges are posted to student accounts **mid-November**.

- PLEASE NOTE: Check your student account regularly, as **no bills are mailed to students or parents**.

MAKING A PAYMENT

UAH has four payment options for student bills:

ONLINE

Online through your myUAH account, you can pay with credit/debit cards (2.95% service fee), electronic checks, or international wire transfers.

MAIL

Mailed payments must be received (not postmarked) by the payment deadline to be considered on time. Please mail your direct check payments or 529 payments (DO NOT include scholarship or third-party payments) to the Bursar's Office Payment Address:

IN PERSON


You may present cash, checks, or money orders in person.

- The Bursar's Office is located in the Student Services Building, 123.
- Office hours are M-F, 8:15 a.m.-5:00 p.m.
- Please have your 'A number' ready for the cashier.

DROP BOX

Only place check or money-order payments in the drop box.

- Place payments in the secure drop box outside the Bursar's Office.
- Include your 'A number' on your check/money order.



REFUNDS

If your aid exceeds your cost of attendance, you may be eligible to receive a refund. UAH now utilizes BankMobile Disbursements, a technology solution, powered by BMTX, Inc. to deliver your refund. With BankMobile Disbursements, you choose how you want to receive your refund.

SETTING UP AN AUTHORIZED USER

Setting up an authorized user on the bill payment area of myUAH allows access to upcoming due dates, payment and account activity, and the ability to make payments on behalf of the student. It is imperative to set up an authorized user if someone other than the student will be making payments. This authorized user also has access to the communications associated with the account, including payment reminders, rebalancing notifications, and other important announcements.

HOUSING & RESIDENCE LIFE

4 Types of Charger Card Accounts

1 MEAL PLANS

- ▶ Prepaid meal credits that reset at the end of the semester
- ▶ Expires at the end of each semester
- ▶ Can be used at the Charger Café, The Den, or Burrito Bowl

2 CHARGER BUCKS

- ▶ Companion to a Meal Plan
- ▶ Expires at the end of each semester
- ▶ Can be used at all on-campus dining locations
- ▶ Additional funds cannot be added

3 DINING DOLLARS

- ▶ Declining balance account used for food purchases
- ▶ Can be carried over from fall to spring semester
- ▶ Can be used at all on-campus dining locations
- ▶ Additional funds can be added at any point

4 FLEX

- ▶ Declining balance account used at all vendors on campus
- ▶ Can be carried over every semester while a student has an active account
- ▶ Can be used at copiers, dining locations, the UAH Bookstore, and vending

CHARGER CARD MOBILE ID


The Charger Card Mobile ID is your photo identification for campus! The Mobile ID also offers four types of declining-balance debit accounts with no service fees.

There is a one-time fee of \$10 added to your student account. If you prefer a physical plastic Charger Card, one can be printed at a cost of \$25 upon request. If your phone or card is lost or stolen, notify the Charger Card Office immediately.

FOLLOW THESE STEPS TO SET UP YOUR UAH CHARGER CARD MOBILE ID

1. Make sure you have installed any pending phone updates. For Android devices, make sure NFC is turned on.
2. Upload a photo for your Mobile ID by going online to myUAH, then Campus Services > Charger Card > Online Photo Submission. You may also have a photo taken in our office (CGU 131).
3. Download the eAccounts mobile app using this QR code. 
4. Type "Huntsville," choose The University of Alabama in Huntsville, and log into UAH SSO.
5. Tap the "Add to Wallet" button in the upper right-hand corner and wait for confirmation!

Now use your Charger Card Mobile ID to access buildings, pay for dining, library services, accessing the Fitness Center, and more!

IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

To ensure the health and safety of our campus, immunizations against communicable diseases are extremely important. All new and incoming transfer students must upload an immunization printout from their health care provider or a health department certificate showing proof of required vaccinations.

These include:

- ▶ Meningococcal ACWY vaccine on/after the age of 16,
- ▶ 2 MMR vaccines on/after the age of 12 months, and a
- ▶ Tuberculosis Risk Questionnaire

PARKING

All students, employees, and others who operate and park a vehicle on campus must pay the annual parking fee (\$140), register your vehicle(s), and correctly display a current parking permit. Employees and students should visit parking.uah.edu to pay parking fees and register vehicles.

Employees and students with a state-issued handicapped placard must provide paperwork issued by the DMV proving the placard is registered in your name to the Parking Services Office. You will receive a Handicapped Accessibility Hangtag instead of a regular parking hangtag. Fraudulent use of a counterfeit or state disabled hangtag issued to another person will result in a citation and confiscation of the state-issued disabled hangtag.

MOTORCYCLE/MOPED REGISTRATION

Motorcycle/moped registration is \$95, and permits go on sale for freshmen on July 5. Please allow at least 3 days for processing.

BIKE REGISTRATION

Students are required to register their bicycles. There is no charge for this service. Once the registration is complete, you will receive an email notifying you that your permit is available to be picked up.
