

The Carolyne Pride Bell and Robert Kirk Bell Memorial Scholarship

The Carolyne Pride Bell and Robert Kirk Bell Memorial Scholarship is awarded to a full-time undergraduate student and is based on academic merit and financial need.

The scholarship was established in 1986 through a bequest to the University by Carolyne Pride Bell, a long-time Huntsville resident who was married to Robert Kirk Bell. She had a sincere desire to see her community become a better place for all, and recognized the importance of education in enriching people's lives. Because of her desire to help underprivileged and deserving students attend UAH, Mrs. Bell generously endowed this scholarship through her will.

This scholarship is renewable for up to three additional years. The student must maintain a full-time course load (12 credit hours) each semester. In addition, recipients must complete a total of 24 credit hours each academic year and have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher to be eligible for renewal. Students should submit a scholarship application every year in order to update their files and possibly be eligible for other awards.
