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Advising

The College of Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences has centralized academic advising for all of your general education courses. However, all art students should connect early with a Department Faculty Advisor. Faculty advisors best know the ins and outs of the program and can help you pick what you need to be both successful in your future career and keep you on track for graduation. Check in with the department chair to find out who will be your advisor.

1 Studio courses are 2.5 hrs long and require a lot of work. You don't want to save them all for the end; you'll get tired fast!

BA vs...

- Needs Minor

+ Must do upper-level courses in at least two studio areas

+ Does not require a portfolio review

If you want to study Art Education or Art History you must do a BA degree.

The BA may be best if you...

- → Want to complete the Web Communications, Game Development & Design, Public History, Theatre, UX, or another minor
- \rightarrow Have plans to go into Art Therapy, Arts Business
- \rightarrow Have a broad variety of studio interests

+ No Minor

+ Will complete more upper level courses in the concentration

...BFA

- + More Art History courses
- + Requires passing a portfolio review to be admitted to the program
- + Graduating seniors must complete a solo exhibition OR professional design/animation portfolio

- \rightarrow Are interested in intensive study in one major area
- → Want to take more studio classes
- \rightarrow Want more exposure to Art History

To apply you need to have:

- ☑ 3.0 GPA in your art history and studio classes
- ✓ 1 drawing
- I piece with color
- ✓ 1 3D piece
- 2 pieces relating to your concentration
- ☑ Short essays about you and why the BFA is right for you

Don't Panic! Your professors will help you prepare.

If you're unsure, you don't have to choose right away as
both programs share requirements. Talk to your faculty
advisor to help you choose what works for you.

The Student Health Center is in Wilson Hall, 3rd floor, Room 325. Counseling Center

They provide counseling for stress management and anxiety; interpersonal relationships with friends, family, or peers; LGBTQ understanding; cultural issues and diversity, disordered eating and body image issues; and more. Creative Experiences

Exhibitions

In the fall, the Department hosts a Foundations Show to celebrate work created in introductory classes. Every spring, we host the Annual Juried Student Show, an exhibition of student work done over the past year. We invite an outside juror to assess the work and give awards. Prizes include scholarships and cash.

The Research or Creative Experience for Undergraduates

RCEU is a summer program that allows students to have a hands-on experience working with researchers/faculty members on a creative/research project. The fellowship prize is \$3200. Speak to your professors for more information.

Study Abroad

The department offers a class that travels to England to study the beginnings of Photography and 19th century photographic techniques. Students participate in a group exhibition to showcase photographs of their experience abroad. The college also offers a number of faculty-led study-abroad courses and programs.
