Jump into the exciting world of film creation at UAH. Our Film & Media Arts program offers a variety of subjects for students interested in video and media production technologies, including live event and broadcast studio production. The program is flexible in its structure, allowing students to engage in courses that combine skills and interests, such as sound and music technology or animation, with video production remaining the core focus. The combination of both production and film studies allows students to get experience in a variety of production roles.

Biannually film students create a feature film! The year-long process exposes students to script writing, talent selection, set creation, film production, editing, and more!

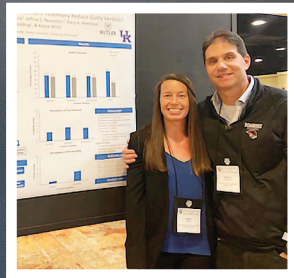




“ I’m a Human Factors Engineering Psychologist, which means I study how we can make technology work for people. One of my primary areas of research focuses on how human interactions with automation affect their trust in that automation, which can then influence future interactions. I love teaching at UAH for a ton of reasons, but my favorite part is that UAH is grounded in a tradition of interdisciplinary collaboration, and so our students are routinely exposed to ways of thinking which extend beyond just one area of study. Many of the problems we currently face, and certainly those we will face in the future, are ones in which collaboration between Psychologists, Engineers, Philosophers, Designers, Computer Scientists, and others will be necessary; UAH has cultivated the environment in which to make those collaborations happen. ”

“ Under the advisement of Dr. Neuschatz, the Psychology and Law (PaL) lab conducts research on topics such as the influence of jailhouse informant testimony on jury decision-making, prosecutorial vouching, and criminal trials involving domestic violence. As a graduate student in the PaL lab, I have had the opportunity to mentor undergraduate students in developing research, analyzing and interpreting data, and presenting their findings for the psychology capstone course as well as for their individual research goals. I also had the opportunity to present a poster on our recent research about jailhouse informant testimony at the American Psychology-Law Society (AP-LS) Annual Conference in Philadelphia. I even got to run the “Rocky Steps” while there!”

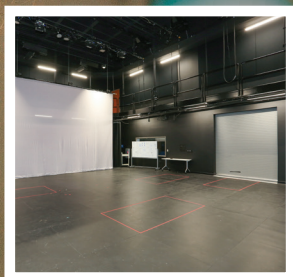
FACILITIES

ART GALLERIES & LABS

Student artists exhibit in one of the three major galleries on campus, including Wilson Hall Gallery, Salmon Library Gallery, and the Union Grove Gallery. Of course, all creations start in our state-of-the-art studios and labs – including painting & drawing, sculpture, animation, graphic design, photography, and printmaking.



BLACK BOX THEATRE

Black Box Theatre connects the audience to the performers in a purposeful and uninterrupted way. Our NEW black box theatre features a catwalk, control, and green room. Plus, modular risers for different seating options.



MORTON HALL

Originally opened in 1960, it was the first academic building on the UAH campus. After a \$30 million dollar renovation in 2020, Morton Hall (110,000 square feet) features completely new classroom spaces, collaborative seminar rooms, study areas, research labs, and a black box theatre.



ROBERTS RECITAL HALL

Student musicians, faculty, and international artists grace this main stage! This is our 225-seat performance hall. You can come to hear performers on our Yamaha DCFX concert grand piano - one of only 13 in the country - or be inspired to create by hopping in one of our adjacent recording studios!
