DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Our Town is a play that broke all the conventions of its time. No set, no props, an omniscient narrator, direct address to the audience, actors in the audience, flashbacks, supernatural characters – this play is anything but realistic. But with all this breaking of traditions, its core of community, hope, and love shines through and speaks to all of us about the best parts of ourselves – our compassion, our empathy, and our need to make connections with others. It is easy, especially in our current moment (I can't bear to say "unprecedented" anymore, can you?), to focus on the parts of others that we dislike, the parts that push us away, the parts that we wish didn't exist. In this equation, of course, we are both the hero and the bad guy; but, in Grover's Corners, New Hampshire, we are reminded that it truly doesn't have to be this way. We can love our neighbor as ourselves. We can put our focus outward. We can be community.

To that end, and to steal, with love, from Lin–Manuel Miranda, this production of *Our Town* is a story about America then told by America now. America now is complex and diverse, and that is beautiful. That is community. I hope you see yourself in the folks of Grover's Corners.


NOLAN STUESSY

ABOUT UAH THEATRE



UAH Theatre is an entrepreneurial, pre-professional training program that works to put you in charge of your career within the entertainment industry. Our curriculum is based on making you an artist who can create your own opportunities, rather than waiting for jobs to find you. We are a small, but actively growing program, and because of that, our majors aren't sectioned off into "actors only," "designers only," "stage managers only," etc. UAH Theatre majors learn how to be good at everything, which means you have maximum employability once you graduate. Our majors also start working from the first semester of their freshman year.

UAH Theatre produces four plays a season, including a musical, and we collaborate very closely with the UAH Music Department. Our curriculum for majors includes 39 hours – 24 hours of core courses, 9 hours of an emphasis (design/technology, performance, or dramaturgy), and 6 hours of electives. We also offer a minor that encompasses 24 hours of core courses and electives.

As a program, we function like a company, with everyone working together on each production, and class sizes are small and student-centered. We take pride in being on a first-name basis with each other.

Scholarships are available and there is a competitive application process that happens at the start of each school year.
