RESEARCH

My current research focuses on the ethical evaluation of derogatory language. By looking at speech on social media, humor, and solitary speech, a coauthor and I explain the ways in which slurring behaviors can be morally problematic even when they do not directly cause harm. In bioethics, I am writing a paper about the contributions of racialized rhetoric to discrimination in healthcare, and have recently started a new paper that uses resources from pragmatics to assess recent attempts to revive the "expressivist argument" used by the disability rights critique of selective abortion. I also have ongoing research projects in environmental and feminist ethics.
