The Defense & Counterintelligence Security Agency (DCSA) Security Assessment – 2025



On **September 16 & 17** the ORS Team completed a DCSA Security Assessment the overall rating was a **SUPERIOR** – **the highest rating!!!** The purpose of these security assessments is to evaluate a defense contractor's ability to protect classified data. Achieving a minimum of a satisfactory rating on this assessment is essential for maintaining your Facility Clearance and continuing to work with classified information. The assessment is also a way to ensure a contractor is complying with the policies and procedures outlined in the National Industrial Security Program Operating Manual (NISPOM) 32 CFR Part 117.

If you have a clearance, what contract are you supporting? Does this matter? YES it matters!

A company determines whether an employee will require access to classified information in performance of tasks or services related to the fulfillment of a classified contract. Once the company makes this determination, the individual may be processed for a security clearance. The company determines the positions that require a security clearance, as well as the level required, based upon the duties and responsibilities of each position. This determination is based on contractual needs and requirements which is provided in the DD Form 254 Contract Security Classification Specification (for contracts involving contractor access to classified information. This form identifies for contractors the areas of classified information involved.)

#### What is Controlled Unclassified Information (CUI)?

<u>CUI is sensitive information</u> that does not meet the criteria for classification but must still be protected. It is Government-created or owned UNCLASSIFIED information that allows for, or requires, safeguarding and dissemination controls in accordance with laws, regulations, or Government-wide policies.

<u>CUI is a control marking</u>, not a classification marking. CUI policy provides a uniform marking system across the Federal Government that replaces a variety of agency-specific markings, such as FOUO, LES, SBU, etc. <u>CUI markings alert recipients that special handling may be required to comply with law, regulation, or Government-wide policy.</u>

- Allegiance to the United States, Foreign Affiliation, Influence and Preference
- Handling Protected Information and Use of Information Technology
- Media Contact and Financial Considerations
- Personal Changes and Conduct, Adverse Information, Criminal Conduct, Sexual Behavior
- Alcohol Consumption, Drug Involvement and Substance Misuse
- Treatment and Counseling, Psychological Conditions and Emotional Health
- Personal Finance/Business Interests and Foreign Interests
- Foreign/Suspicious Contacts, Foreign Travel,
- Loss, Compromise or Suspected Compromise of Classified Information

Also, remember not share work or personal inforantion such as any kind of travel and clearance inforantion on social media whether that's Facebook, Instagram or Linkedin just to name a few.
