UAHRA General Meeting
Minutes
March 3 2022, 2:00 PM in SSB 313

The meeting of the UAH Retirees Association was held on March 3, 2022 in SSB 313 on the UAH campus. 28 members were in attendance. Coffee and cookies were provided. Key chain tags for members were handed out as people came in.

Jack Fix called the meeting to order. He reminded attendees of the play on Sunday March 6, “The Works of William Shakespeare, Abridged.” 37 plays in 90 minutes”. Royce Boyer has arranged a discount for UAHRA members of \$5 admission. Reservations must be made by contacting Royce by Friday, March 4.

Jack then introduced Interim President Karr as our speaker.

Notes on Dr. Karr’s Talk

Dr. Karr is happy to be in Huntsville and at UAH. He gave up being retired at the beach to take this interim position because he believes in UAH and this area. We have great people – great students, faculty and staff. We have a great environment here with Cummings Research Park right across the street. He wants UAH to strive for excellence and develop a culture where everyone can be successful.

He pointed out 4 areas for emphasis.

- 1) We need to grow the enrollment in order to meet the workforce demands and we need to increase the number of beds available to students on campus so they can afford to come here. He noted the high cost of apartments in Huntsville.
- 2) We want every student to get a great education; This includes, not only their classes, which he referred to as their schooling, but they also need education through experiences. This includes labs, co-ops, sports, study abroad, etc. These activities enhance their education with experience.
- 3) We need to grow the faculty and staff. If we increase the number of students, we need more people to teach them and to provide services. We must be aggressive in recruiting and be proactive, going after excellent candidates as we anticipate our needs.
- 4) We need more facilities. We need some short term successes in this. For example, they are looking for money for a new engineering building right away. A long term plan includes Executive Plaza across the street being developed with a walkway across to it. There will be a dorm with a dining hall on the first floor as well as other businesses and venues that will provide multiuse space.

Dr. Karr expects to be at UAH about 18 months. He is not interested in being our permanent president. In order to get things done in that short time he said

everyone needs to care a little more, work a little more, and reward and empower people to do their jobs. We need to get early successes so that we can build momentum. UAH has a better starting point than UA had a few years ago and they have had good success.

There was a question and answer period that followed his talk. Key points were:

He is the one who has decided on keeping the masking policy. He is getting feedback from students, staff and faculty about it. He is watching the Covid numbers and getting advice about when the mask requirement for indoors can be lifted.

He stated that the UAS Board of Trustees wants to see UAH succeed and excel. We need to work to get our fair share of the state appropriation in order to do that.

When asked how UAHRA can be involved in these efforts his response was that we can help build esprit de corps with everyone who goes through UAH.

He is very enthusiastic about publicizing the successes of our people and getting our students recognized. We should not be a “best kept secret”.

Although recognizing that there is a need for instructors, especially in undergraduate classes, he realizes we need tenure-track faculty to be doing research, bringing in research dollars and publishing to build our reputation.

Asked about our low graduation rate, he said that we have had some improvement. But we are a high percent

STEM school and STEM has a higher percentage leaving rate. If students are leaving to go TO something that is better than if they are running away from something. Having a large percentage of our students living off campus also contributes to lower graduation rates because they aren't here to take part in activities aimed at helping them succeed.

He was then thanked for speaking with us and the meeting was adjourned.

The general meeting of the UAHRA was held in the Shelby Center for Science and Technology, room 107. There were 15 people in attendance, 13 of which were UAHRA members. Jack Fix called the meeting to order and announced that both Juanita Owen and Charlene Bruce were elected to a 3 year term on the Executive Board beginning right after this meeting. Jack introduced the entire board and recognized Sheila Scruggs many years of service on the board, as she is leaving the board. A small gift was given to Sheila on behalf of the board.

The Finance Report was given so that members present would get that

information. We currently have \$3396 in our account. The scholarship account has \$51, 576 in it. Due to decreases in investments we may be only able to award one scholarship this year. It was pointed out that we need to bring new members into the organization.

Jack Fix introduced the speaker for the meeting, Ms. Wendy Worlund, from UAH OIT. She gave a presentation on cybersecurity for seniors and how to avoid some scams.. She discussed how to keep passwords safe using a password manager. She has made a document about cybersecurity and sent it to Jack. We will make it available to all. The general meeting adjourned at 3:07 PM.

Royce Boyer



Dr. Royce Boyer was one of UAH’s first faculty members and is responsible for

initiating music activities and creating the music department on the UAH campus in 1966.

After he retired in 1997, he moved to Jackson, MS, where he did part-time college teaching and also operated his Cristofori Piano Service – tuning 400 to 500 pianos a year

Jackson was lacking in chamber music, so he started the Mississippi Chamber Music Guild, modeled after the Huntsville Chamber Music Guild, presenting local, regional, national and international chamber ensembles. He also started the Metro-Male Chorus of Jackson and organized (again) the American Southern Chorale, selecting singers from several states. The Chorale toured in China, Russia, and Europe.

Three years ago, Royce returned to Huntsville with his wife Sherry, who he met at a business lunch in Jackson. In Huntsville, he has a contract with UAH to do tuning in the Department of Music. He thoroughly enjoys “banging away” in Roberts Hall and meeting faculty and students from time to time. Right now he is submitting an abstract to present at the College Music Society’s international conference in the three Baltic countries next summer.

He is active in the UAHRA and is currently a member of the Board of Directors.
