Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is the cost of the trip and what does this include?

The cost estimation: (partial financial aid is possible based on need, but no guarantee).

The total expense is ~\$3,500, in addition to UAH tuition (UG: \$1,157 for in-state or \$2,613 for out-of-state; Graduate: \$1,780 for in-state or \$3,997 for out-of-state), including:

- Roundtrip airfare approximately \$1,600 (arranged individually by students, it may be much lower if booked early), may vary depending on time and airlines.
- Program Fee: \$1,650, covering domestic transportation, lodging, meals, and travel health insurance during the stay in China
- Passport \$135 (if you do not have one)
- Visa application fee \$140 and agency service charge \$60 (regular handling. More expensive for rush service)
- Pocket money for souvenirs, snacks, meals on evening forays, etc.
- 2. How/when would I register for this trip?

The course will be listed in the summer schedule and the registration begins on April 1.

3. What timeline for down-payments, paperwork, meetings?

The application is due January 19 along with initial payment of \$300. Two further payments of \$650 each are respectively due February 15 and March 7 [The total program fee is \$1650].

4. Any immunizations or special things necessary?

There is no requirement, but some immunizations are recommended. Here is the link to CDC's view on that issue:
